	The SHA continues its mission to provide safe, decent and sanitary housing conditions for low-income, very low-income and extremely low-income families and to manage reserves efficiently to enable our ongoing participation with this program. The SHA will promote personal, economic and social upward mobility to provide families the opportunity to make the transition from subsidized to non-subsidized housing free from discrimination.

	During the next five years the SHA will continue to develop partnerships with local agencies, municipalities and non-profits in order to promote the creation or acquisition of more affordable housing in our area. We promise to utilize the vouchers allotted and look for additional opportunities to apply for more. We will implement all HOTMA and NSPIRE changes as effectively directed. And, we will nourish our relationships with community partners to identify opportunity areas for racial/ethnic minorities, persons with disabilities, families with children and other protected classes so we may better serve through our continuous advocacy and engagement in providing safe, secure and sanitary housing.

	In the last 5-years the SHA has met its previous goal by adding 3 regular Housing Choice Vouchers and 12 Foster Youth to Independence Vouchers to our program. The SHA has also increased its minority participation in its HCV program. The HCV program demographics reflect a total of assisted participants are 16% minorities which is an increase of 2% from five years ago. The demographics further identify 8% of the participants are Black/AA and 8% Hispanic/Latino. 34% of the total 98 individuals in the program are disabled. 78.6% are over 60.

	Our agency continues to make available the most up-to-date information in its Administrative Plan for the VAWA component. Information is provided on-line and in writing for those requesting it. It is also posted in the main office / community room location. Our agency continues to work with the area domestic violence advocates by providing referrals to applicants and participants to assist them in safely securing and maintaining affordable housing.

The SHA will continue to pull applicants from the list and review for eligibility to the program. In addition, we will mirror our state Fair Marketing Plan where the SHA shall biennially determine whether the percentage for each minority group in the program is significantly below the minority group in the applicable metropolitan area. Significantly will be defined as a difference of 1% or more. If necessary, the SHA will consider an additional priority/preference component to the list to further promote diversity in its programs.

The SHA will make a concerted effort to seek out minority advocates, newspapers and groups in the So. County of the Berkshires as well as the Pittsfield Metro Area in order to disseminate information on the application process and wait lists. Advertisements will be sought in publications that serve minorities. Notices will also be sent to organizations to ensure affirmative outreach to under represented minority groups.

Information on the procedures to apply to the HCV program will be made available to local advocacy agencies, area Council on Aging groups and, social work departments of hospitals and extended care facilities.
